Students who are part of this agreement will be admitted to the Criminology program upon transferring to West Virginia University, so long as they have a C or better in SCY 1110 (WVU SOC 101).

Students completing degrees from the WVU Eberly College of Arts and Sciences are encouraged to work with their advisors to integrate completion of an academic minor or minors into their programs of study. WVU offers over 100 minors that complement major fields of study, build on students' unique interests, expand perspectives, and broaden skills. Pierpont Community and Technical College students may begin completion of certain minors at PCTC by utilizing elective hours to take courses equivalent to the minor's introductory requirements at WVU.

Unlike the other articulated plan of study to the WVU Criminology major, which are Associate of Arts degrees, this is an Associate of Applied Science. AAS degrees do not satisfy the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU as AA or AS degrees do. Therefore, as indicated in the final two years curriculum, students should work with their advisor to ensure the completion of this requirement.

Students transferring to West Virginia University with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will have satisfied the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU.
